The schedule for next year will grant them 2 credits for each core class and one credit in each of the other categories. 48 credits are required for a College Preparatory Diploma. Each credit represents one semester satisfactorily completed. Below the graduation requirements is a tentative schedule of how your student will meet those requirements.

WNS Honor Roll

Middle and High School recognize scholastic achievement with the Honor Roll. There are two levels of honor:

Honors requires students to achieve at least one A and the rest B's with no C's.

High Honors requires students to achieve all A's in their core classes (Math, English, Science, Social Studies and for the High School, Foreign Language) and allows one B in other classes besides those previously listed.
